5. Heat

1. Read owner's manual After unpacking this product, read the owner's manual carefully, and follow all the operating and other instructions.



2. Power Sources

This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For products in-



tended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

- 3. Grounding or Polarization
 - This product may be equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert

the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.

4. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, and these openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product on a bed,



10. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

11. Power Lines

12. Lightning

For added protection for this product during storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the produnt due to lightning and power-ling






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


HOW TO USE THE REMOTE CONTROL


This section explains how to get ready for remote control operation.

Setting up the Remote Control

• Open the battery compartment lid on the rear panel.




2 Install 2 batteries ("AAA" size) following the polarity diagrams.



Close the battery compartment lid.



4 Point the remote control at the VCR and press the buttons within the operating range as illustrated.

Distance: within about 7 m from the front of the remote sensor

Angles: within about 30° in every direction

- The life of the batteries is about 1 year depending on the conditions of use.
- If the remote control does not operate correctly, replace all batteries with new ones.
- Do not dispose of the batteries by fire.
- If the remote control is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery corrosion.

Caring for the Remote Control


- When using the remote control, press the buttons at intervals of about 1 second to ensure the correct mode of operation.
- Keep the remote control away from extremely hot or humid places and avoid sharp impacts.
- Do not expose the remote sensor of the VCR to a strong light source such as direct sunlight or illumination.
- Be careful not to spill water on the remote control or to place it on anything wet.

CONNECTIONS

Before you use this VCR, it is necessary to connect it to your TV. Several ways of connecting are available depending on your use of TV or cable box. Select one which is applicable to your equipment.


Antenna/VCR/TV Connection

- Disconnect the antenna cable from your TV and connect it to the RF IN terminal on the VCR.
- 2 Connect the RF OUT terminal to the TV.
 - Connect the supplied power code to the AC socket (MAINS SUPPLY) of the VCR.





Connecting your cable box using the LINE IN 1 (AUDIO/VIDEO) jacks

To watch or record a channel via the connected cable box, press the INPUT SELECT button so that the VCR display shows "L1". For details, see page 30.

Connecting your TV using the AUDIO/VIDEO OUT jacks It is not necessary to set the output channel selector (3CH/4CH) on the VCR and TV channel 3 or 4. To watch video pictures, set the video input mode on your TV. For the video input mode, refer to the manual of your TV. PREPARATION

MULTI BRAND REMOTE CONTROL

The remote control can be compatible with various brands of TV by setting their control codes. The TOSHIBA code has initially been set to control TOSHIBA TVs.





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INTEL-A-PLAY Function

This function lets you make a set of basic operations on both the VCR and the TV by simply pressing a button.

Setting up the fith Preparation · See "MULTI BRAND REMOTE CONTROL" on below. page 11 and make your TV compatible with this VCR. · Locate the VCR and a TV as close as possible so STANDBY both units can receive the infrared signals from the remote control. Press the **STANDBY** button firmly several times 15 until "READY" appears on the TV screen. Do not press it over and over again quickly, or this function may not work. READY Notes 15 Press the STANDBY button to select TV 2 channel 3, 4 or the video input mode. Each time you press the button, the screen changes as follows. $3ch \rightarrow 4ch \rightarrow Video input mode (ex. VIDEO IN 1)$

The setting is finished and the function is now available.

By pressing a button, the VCR and TV work as TV: Turns on. 15 Selects the video channel (3 or 4) or video input mode as you have set. VCR: Turns on. 16 TV: Turns off. VCR: Rewinds the tape to the beginning and then turns off. 17 Turns on. VCR: Turns on and displays a screen for VCR Plus+ programming.

- Do not press the STANDBY button while "READY" is on the TV screen, or the memory of the input source is
- canceled. If that happens, repeat the setting again.
 If your TV has more than one external input, connect the VCR to the first input jack (ex. VIDEO IN 1, LINE IN 1, E1, and etc.) of the TV, or the INTEL-A-PLAY function won't work even though it is compatible with the VCR.
- Depending on the TV you use, this function may not be compatible with your set. Due to different manufacturing sources from TV brands, INTEL-A-PLAY might not work even though the manual shows compatibility with your brand.
- This function is not available when the VCR is in the recording mode.

Video Cassette Use

Loading a Cassette

Push the cassette into the cassette compartment with the window side facing up and the label side towards the front. The VCR is automatically turned on. The OO indicator will appear in the VCR display.



Ejecting a Cassette

Press the **EJECT** button. The cassette is ejected from the cassette compartment.

Warning

Do not insert your hands or any foreign objects into the compartment. This may result in injury or damage. Take special care with children to avoid accidents.

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Video cassettes have a safety tab to prevent accidental erasure. If the tab has already removed, recording cannot be performed.

- To prevent accidental erasure Remove this safety tab with a screwdriver.
- To record again Cover the tab hole with adhesive tape.






• Avoid exposing cassettes to direct sunlight. Keep them away from heaters.

Avoid extreme humidity, vibrations or shock, strong magnetic fields (near a motor, transformer or magnet) and dusty place.






Counter Function

You can view the clock, linear time counter or tape remaining time in the VCR display or on the TV screen.



Index Search Function

The VCR can find a point where a registered index signal is on a tape and play back for about 5 seconds. You can easily locate the desired program by inputting the index signal.


Basic Recording

Preparation

- Turn on the VCR.
- Select the video channel (3 or 4) or video input mode on the TV.
- Set the VCR/TV selector to "VCR".
- If you record cable channels via the cable box, finish the cable box set-up (pages 27 and 28), and turn on the cable box.

Load a cassette with the safety tab attached.

2 Press the **TV/VCR** button so that the "VCR" indicator appears in the VCR display.



Select a channel to record with the CHANNEL buttons on the VCR, or the CH/TRK buttons or number buttons on the remote control.



- If you see "L1" or "L2" in the VCR display, press the **INPUT SELECT** button so that the channel number appears.
- If you record cable channels via the cable box, make the output channel number of the cable box or "L1" appear, depending on your connection. (See page 10.)
- Press the **SP/SLP** button to select the recording **12** tape speed.






- SLP: Suitable for tripling recording time, but with less picture and sound quality than using the SP mode.



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



VCR Plus+ SET-UP




