Playback Region Number

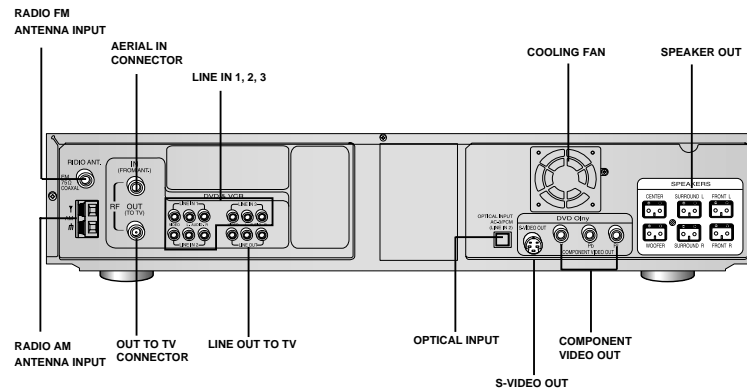
Both the DVD player and the discs are coded by region. These regional codes must match in order for the disc to play. If the codes do not match, the disc will not play.

The Region Number for this player is described on the rear panel of the player.

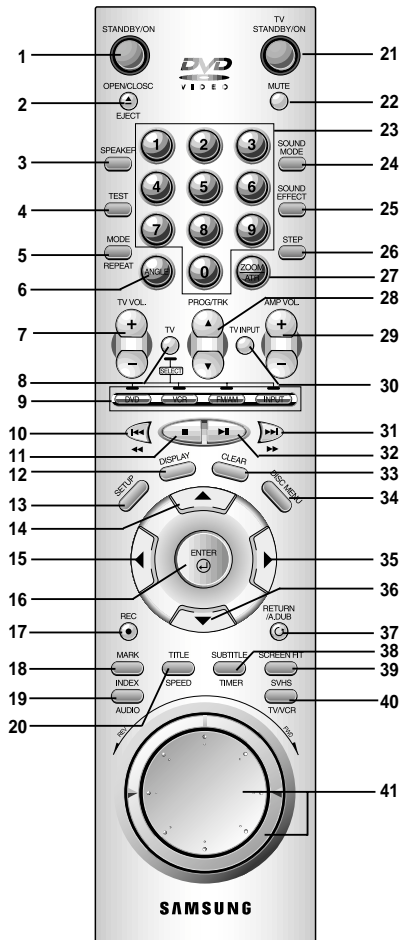
Front View of the DVD-VCR



Rear View of the DVD-VCR

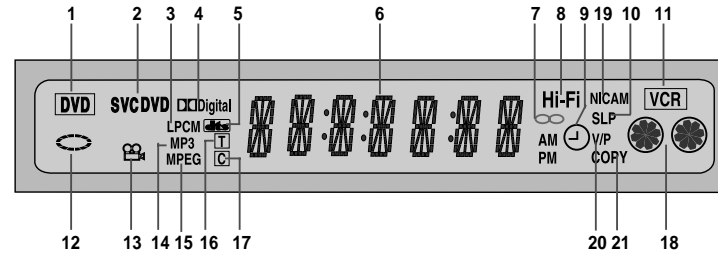

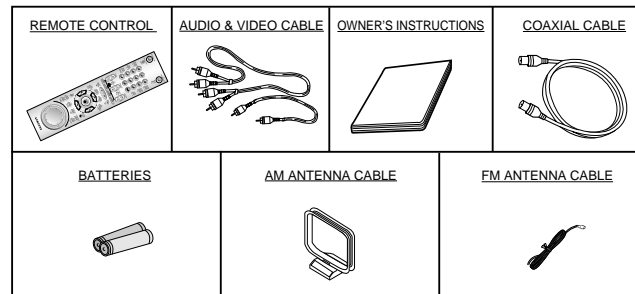

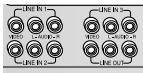






Deciding How to Connect DVD-VCR

You must take into account various factors when connecting audio or video systems:

- ◆ Types of connectors available on your systems
- ◆ Systems connected permanently to the DVD-VCR (satellite receiver for example) or temporarily (camcorder for example)

Your DVD-VCR is equipped with the following connectors.



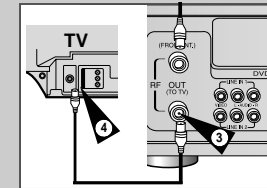
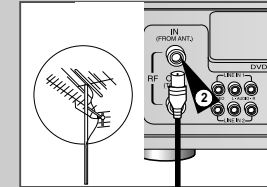
Connecting DVD-VCR to the TV using the Coaxial Cable

To receive television programmes a signal must be received from one of the following sources:

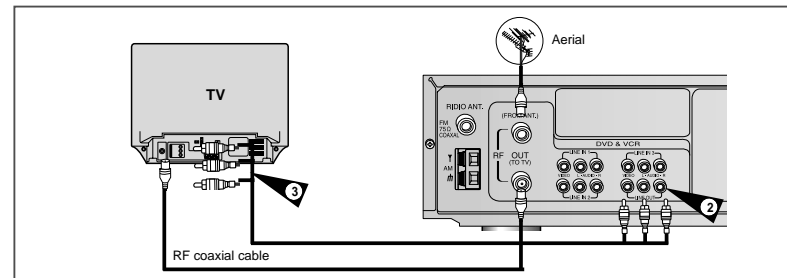
- ◆ An outdoor aerial
- ◆ An indoor aerial
- ◆ A cable television network
- ◆ A satellite receiver

Make sure that both the television and the DVD-VCR are switched off before connecting the cables.

- 1 Remove the aerial or network input cable from the television.
- 2 Connect this cable to the 75Ω coaxial socket marked  on the rear of your DVD-VCR.
- 3 Plug the coaxial cable supplied into the  socket on your DVD-VCR.
- 4 Plug the other end of the coaxial cable into the connector previously used for the aerial on the television.
- 5 To obtain better quality pictures and sound on your television, you can also connect your DVD-VCR to the television via the RCA cable (see section below) if your television is equipped with this type of connection.



Connecting DVD-VCR to the TV using the RCA Cable



You can connect your DVD-VCR to the television using the RCA cable if the appropriate input is available on the television. You thus:

- ◆ Obtain better quality sound and pictures
- ◆ Simplify the setting up procedure of your DVD-VCR

Regardless of the type of connection chosen, you must always connect the coaxial cable supplied. Otherwise, no picture will be visible on the screen when the DVD-VCR is switched off.

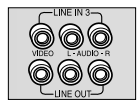
Make sure that both the television and the DVD-VCR are switched off before connecting the cables.

- 1 Connect the coaxial cable as indicated in the above section.
- 2 Connect one end of the RCA Audio/Video cable to the Video output and Audio L, R output socket on the rear of the DVD-VCR.
- 3 Plug the other end into the appropriate connector on the television.

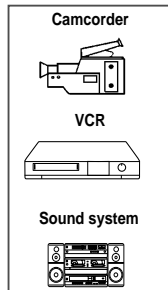
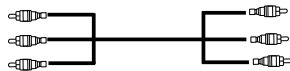
Connecting Other Equipment to Your DVD-VCR

You can connect other audio and/or video equipment to your DVD-VCR in different ways. The following illustrations give a few examples of the connection possibilities.

- The RCA input/output connectors on the rear of the DVD-VCR are used for equipment, such as camcorders, VCRs or sound systems.

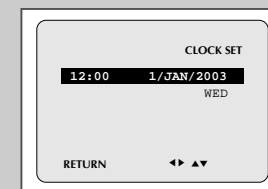
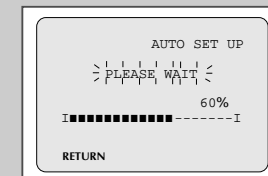
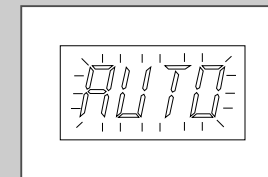
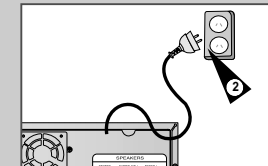
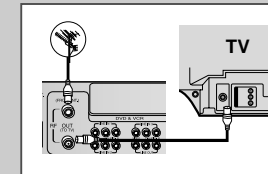


Plug & Auto Set Up

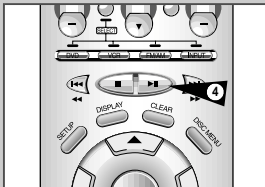
Your DVD-VCR will automatically set itself up when it is plugged into the mains for the first time. TV stations will be stored in memory. The process takes a few minutes. Your DVD-VCR will then be ready for use.

- 1 Connect the coaxial cable as indicated on page 11. (Connecting Your DVD-VCR to the TV Using the Coaxial Cable)
- 2 Plug the DVD-VCR into the mains.
Result: The **LANGUAGE SET** menu is displayed.
- 3 Select the required language by pressing the **▲** or **▼** buttons.
- 4 Press **ENTER** to store the language selected.
Result: A message appears.
- 5 Press **ENTER** to start the auto scanning.
 - ◆ The number of stations automatically stored by the DVD-VCR depends on the number of stations that it has found.
- 6 Check the data and time. (see page 17)
- 7 On completion, press **RETURN** to exit the menu.

- ◆ Auto preset can be performed by pressing **(STOP)** on the DVD-VCR continuously for 5 seconds or more with no tape inserted.



Tuning Your Television for the DVD-VCR



You must tune your television for the DVD-VCR only if you are not using a RCA cable

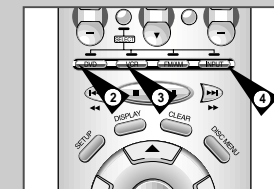
➤ To view pictures from your DVD-VCR when a RCA cable is used, the television must be set to the audio/video mode (AV).

- 1 Switch on the television.
- 2 Switch on the DVD-VCR by pressing STANDBY/ON on the front of the DVD-VCR or STANDBY/ON on the remote control.
- 3 Select a programme position on the television to be reserved for use with your DVD-VCR.
- 4 Insert the video cassette in the DVD-VCR. Check that the DVD-VCR starts reading the cassette; if not, press ►|| button.
- 5 Start a scan on your television or set the television to UHF channel 38 (Newzealand:UHF 36 CH).
- 6 Fine tune the television until the pictures and sound are obtained clearly.
- 7 If you cannot find the pictures and sound, or there is interference from nearby channels, it may be necessary to change the setting of the DVD-VCR output channel (see Setting the DVD-VCR Output Channel on page 23 and Problems and Solutions on page 75).
- 8 When the picture and sound are perfectly clear, store this channel at the desired programme position on the television.
Result: That programme is now reserved for use with your DVD-VCR.

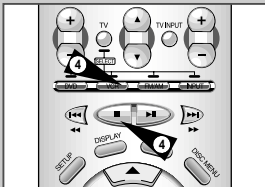
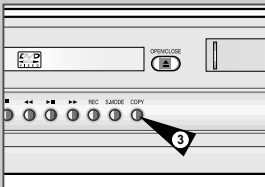
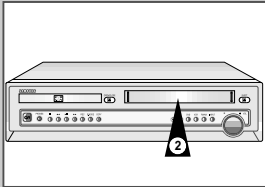
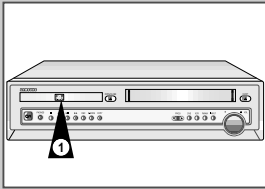
Deck Control Keys

The DVD-VCR uses one set of controls to operate both decks. The following keys are helpful in successfully controlling each deck.

- 1 **STANDBY/ON Button**
Press the STANDBY/ON button on the remote control or front panel to turn on the DVD-VCR.
- 2 **DVD Button**
Press the DVD button on the remote control when you want to control the DVD deck.
◆ The DVD indicator will light on the Front Panel Display to show that the DVD deck is selected.
- 3 **VCR Button**
Press the VCR button on remote control when you want to control the VCR deck.
◆ The VCR indicator will light on the Front Panel Display to show that VHS deck is selected.
- 4 **INPUT Button**
Press the INPUT button repeatedly to cycle through all of your input sources, including the Tuner (PR##), Line 1, Line 2 and Line 3 (rear AV input).



Copying from DVD to VCR



The DVD-VCR allows you to copy the contents of a DVD to a VHS tape with a press of the COPY button.



If the DVD you are attempting to copy is copy protected, you will not be able to copy the disc. It is not permitted to copy Macrovision® encoded DVDs.

- 1 **Insert Disc**
Insert the disc you wish to copy in the DVD deck and close the drawer.
- 2 **Insert VHS Tape**
Insert a blank VHS videotape into the VCR deck.
- 3 **Copy the DVD to VHS Tape**
Press the COPY button on the DVD-VCR front panel.
 - ◆ The DVD will go into Play mode and the VCR will go into Record mode.
 - ◆ If the DVD disc menu appears, you may need to press the PLAY button manually to begin copying.
- 4 **Stop the Copy Process**
When the DVD is finished playing, press the VCR button on the remote control and then press the STOP button to end the copy.
 - ◆ You must stop the Copy process manually when the DVD movie ends or the DVD may replay and record over and over again.



The copy is only active PAL Disc system.

Inserting Batteries in the Remote Control

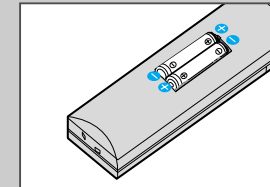
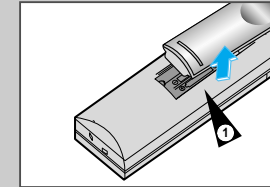
You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:

- ◆ Purchase the DVD-VCR
- ◆ Find that the remote control is no longer working correctly

- 1 Push the tab in the direction of the arrow to release the battery compartment cover on the rear of the remote control.
- 2 Insert two AA, R6 or equivalent batteries, taking care to respect the polarities:
 - ◆ + on the battery with + on the remote control
 - ◆ - on the battery with - on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pushing it back into place.



Do not mix different battery types (manganese and alkaline for example).



Setting the Date and Time

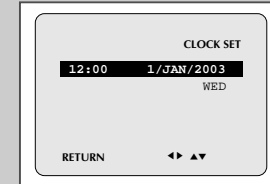
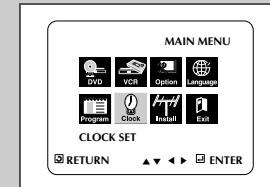
Your DVD-VCR contains a 24-hour clock and calendar used to:

- ◆ Automatically stop programme recording
- ◆ Preset your DVD-VCR to record a programme automatically

You must set the date and time when:

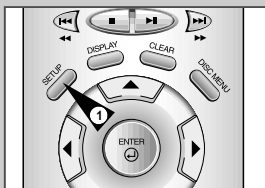
- ◆ You purchase the DVD-VCR
 - ◆ Do not forget to reset the time when you change clocks from winter to summer time and vice versa.

- 1 Press SETUP on the remote control.
Result: The MAIN MENU is displayed.
- 2 Press the corresponding ▲, ▼ or ◀, ▶ buttons to select the CLOCK SET option.
- 3 Press the ENTER button to select this option.
Result: The CLOCK SET menu is displayed.
- 4 Press ◀ or ▶ to select the hour, minutes, day, month and year.
Result: The option selected flashes.
- 5 Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to increase or decrease the value.
Result: The day of the week is displayed automatically.
 - You can hold the ▲ or ▼ buttons down to scroll more quickly through the values.
- 6 On completion, press RETURN twice to exit the menu.

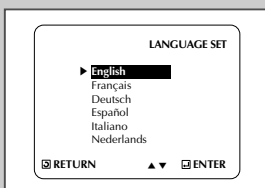

Presetting the Stations Automatically

VCR



You do not need to preset the stations if you have already set them automatically (see Plug & Auto Set Up on page 13).

Your DVD-VCR contains a built-in tuner used to receive television broadcasts.

You must preset the stations received through the tuner. This can be done:

- ◆ Plug & Auto Set up (see page 13)
- ◆ Automatically
- ◆ Manually (see page 20)

You can store up to 80 stations.

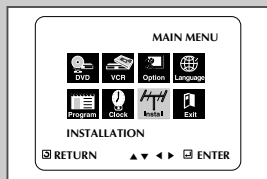
- 1 Press the SETUP button on the remote control.
Result: The MAIN MENU is displayed.
- 2 Press the corresponding ▲, ▼ or ◀, ▶ buttons to select the INSTALLATION option.
- 3 Press the ENTER button to select this option.
Result: The INSTALLATION menu is displayed.
- 4 Press the corresponding ▲ or ▼ buttons, until the AUTO SET UP option is selected.
And then press the ENTER button to select this option.
Result: A message appears, indicating that any channels already preset on your DVD-VCR will be deleted.
- 5 Press ENTER to start the auto scanning.
Result:
 - ◆ The PLEASE WAIT indication flashes on the television screen.
 - ◆ The first frequency band is scanned and the first station found is displayed and stored.
 - ◆ The DVD-VCR then searches for the second station and so on.
 - ◆ When the automatic scanning procedure has finished, the DVD-VCR switches automatically to programme 1.

➤ The number of stations automatically stored by the DVD-VCR depends on the number of stations that it has found.
- 6 If you wish to cancel the auto scanning before the end, press the RETURN button three times to exit the menu.

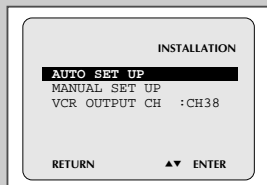


- ◆ Once the auto scanning procedure has finished, some stations may have been stored more than once; select the stations with the best reception and delete the ones no longer required (see page 21).

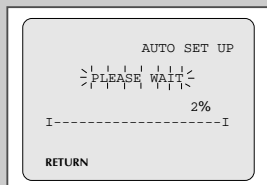
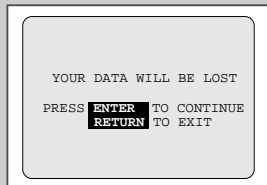
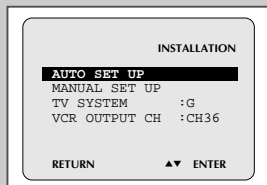

- 1 Press the SETUP button on the remote control.
Result: The MAIN MENU is displayed.
- 2 Press the corresponding ▲, ▼ or ◀, ▶ buttons to select the **INSTALLATION** option.
- 3 Press the ENTER button to select this option.
Result: The **INSTALLATION** menu is displayed.
- 4 Press the corresponding ▲ or ▼ buttons, until the **MANUAL SET UP** option is selected.
- 5 Press the ENTER button to select a **MANUAL SET UP** option.
Result: The **TV STATION TABLE** menu is displayed.
- 6 Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to select a programme number as required.
- 7 Press the ▶ button to preset the station.
Result: The **MANUAL TUNING** menu is displayed.
- 8 Press the ◀ or ▶ buttons to start scanning.
Result: The frequency band is scanned and the first station found is displayed.
- 9 Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons until the **NAME** is selected. The station name is set automatically from the broadcast signal.
- 10 To change the programme's name, press the ▶ button.
Result: The first letter of the name flashes.
- 11

Select a character in the name	Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the required character is displayed (letters, numbers or "-" character).
Move to the next or previous character	Press the ▶ or ◀ buttons respectively.
- 12

If you...	Then...
Wish to store the station displayed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons until the MFT is selected. ◆ Press the ◀ or ▶ buttons to adjust the picture, if necessary. ◆ Press ENTER to store the station
Do not wish to store the station displayed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons until the store CH is selected. ◆ Press the ◀ or ▶ buttons to go on scanning the frequency band and display the next station ◆ Go back to the beginning of Step 12
- 13 Repeat this procedure from Step 6 onwards, until all the required stations have been stored.
- 14 On completion, press the RETURN button three times to exit the menu.

Clearing a Preset Station

If you have stored a TV station:

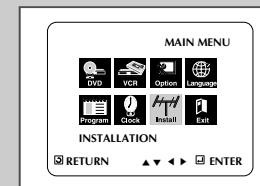
- ◆ *That you do not require*
- ◆ *At the wrong programme position*

you can cancel it.

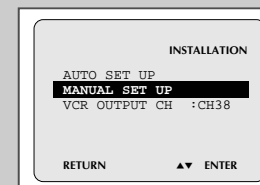
- 1 Press the SETUP button on the remote control.
- 2 Press the corresponding ▲, ▼ or ◀, ▶ buttons to select the **INSTALLATION** option.
- 3 Press the ENTER button to select this option.
Result: The **INSTALLATION** menu is displayed.
- 4 Press the corresponding ▲ or ▼ buttons, until the **MANUAL SET UP** option is selected.
- 5 Press the ENTER button to select this option.
Result: The **TV STATION TABLE** menu is displayed.
- 6 Press the corresponding ▲ or ▼ buttons, until the required preset TV station is selected. (**PR**)
- 7 Press the CLEAR button.
- 8 Repeat the same procedure from Step 6 onwards until all the required stations have been cleared.
- 9 On completion, press the RETURN button three times to exit the menu.

- 5 Likewise, whilst in Picture Search ◀◀ mode, if you press the ◀◀ button again, the VCR will enter normal Rewind mode.
- 6 If, when Rewinding (◀◀) or Fast Forwarding (►►), you press the ◀◀ (or ►►) button, the VCR will enter the Picture Search mode.

VCR Searching for a Specific Sequence

Each time you record a cassette on this VCR, an "index" is automatically marked on the tape when recording starts.

The Search function allows you to fast-forward or rewind to a specific index and start playback from that point. Depending on the direction selected, the indexes are numbered as follows:

- This VCR uses a standard indexing system (VISS). As a result, it will recognize any indexes marked by other VCRs using the same system and vice versa.

INTRO SCAN

- 1 To search for a specific index, press INDEX.
- 2 Press the ◀◀ or ►► buttons depending on the direction where your desired programme is located.
- 3 When an Index mark is found the VCR will playback the tape for 5 seconds, after which it will continue searching for the next Index mark.
- 4 If you want to watch the tape from a particular Index, simply press ►||.

Index Skip Search:

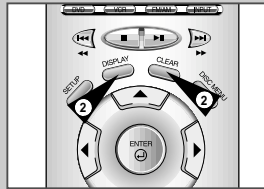
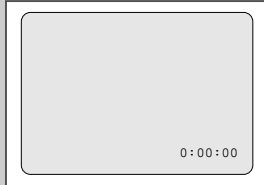


The tape counter:

- 5 Start playing back the cassette to be copied.
- 6 Hold REC (●) down for a while to start recording on your DVD-VCR.
- 7 When you have finished recording, press ■ on both VCR and DVD-VCR.

➤ If you wish to view the cassette being copied:

- ♦ Your DVD-VCR must be connected as usual to the television (see page 11 for further details)



VCR Audio Dubbing a Pre-recorded Cassette

With the Audio Dubbing function, you erase the previously recorded sound and replace it with a new soundtrack from:

- ◆ A CD, DVD
- ◆ A microphone connected to a sound system
- ◆ A cassette player

Restriction:

Audio dubbing is applicable only to the longitudinal audio track (normal audio).

- 1 Connect an RCA audio cable to the appropriate output on your sound system (cassette player for example).

➤ The new sound will be recorded on the normal sound track of the tape, and the original sound will remain on the Hi-Fi sound track. To hear the new sound and original sound mixed together, press the Audio button on the remote control until the MIX option is displayed (see page 36).

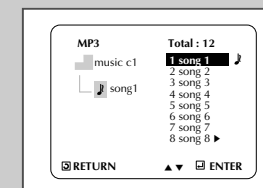
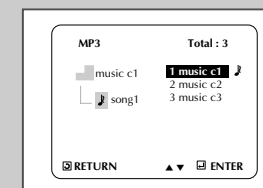
MP3 Play

MP3 is a popular music format which allows you to compress music files up to 1/12 of their original size while retaining near CD quality sound. Your DVD-VCR can playback MP3 files burned onto a CD-R disc.

- 1 **Insert Disc**
Insert a CD-R with MP3 files into the DVD deck.
 - The MP3 main menu will appear after a few seconds and the first song on the disc will begin playing.
- 2 **Select Folder**
Press the up/down buttons to select the folder on the CD-R which contains the MP3 files you want to hear, then press Enter to select.
 - If there are more than 8 folders on the disc, press RETURN to view additional folders.
 - If there are no folders on the CD-R, skip to Step 3.
- 3 **Select MP3 File**
Press the up/down buttons to select the desired MP3 file.
 - If there are more than 8 MP3 files in the selected folder, press the left/right buttons to view additional MP3 files.
 - File names are truncated to eight characters: the first six characters of the song, plus an asterisk (*), then a number.
 - Press the Return button to back up and select another folder.
- 4 **Play MP3 File**
Press the ENTER button on the remote control to play the selected song.
 - While the song is playing, you can use the up/down buttons to browse through other folders.
- 5 **Stop MP3 Selection**
Press the ■ (Stop) button on the remote control to stop playback.

- * To ensure proper playback of discs burned from MP3 files, make sure the files have been recorded at a bit rate of at least 128 kbps.
- * If there are any gaps (blank data) on multi-session discs, you may experience playback problems.
- * On discs that are recorded with a Variable Bit Rate(VBR), e.g. from 32 to 320 kbps, the sound may cut in and out.
- * When the REPEAT button is pressed during playback, the current song will be played back repeatedly.

When playing CD-R MP3 discs, please follow the recommendations below:

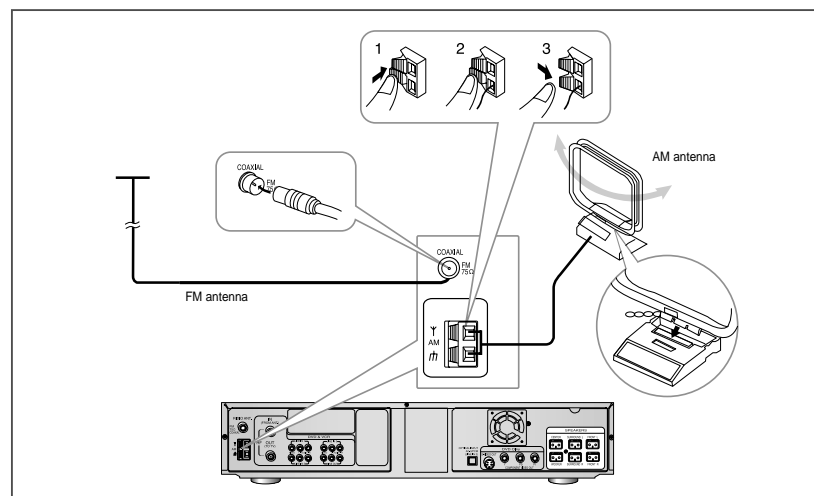
- **Your MP3 files should be ISO 9660 or JOLIET format.**
ISO 9660 format and Joliet MP3 files are compatible with Microsoft's DOS and Windows, and with Apple's Mac. These two formats are the most widely used.
- **When naming your MP3 files do not exceed 8 characters, and place ".mp3" as the file extension.** General name format of: Title.mp3. When composing your title, make sure that you use 8 characters or less, have no spaces in the name, and avoid the use of special characters including: (.,/\,=,+).
- **Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 128 Kbps when recording MP3 files.**
Sound quality with MP3 files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose. Getting audio CD quality sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate (conversion to MP3 format) of at least 128 Kbps and up to 160 Kbps. However, choosing higher rates, like 192 Kbps or more, only rarely give better sound quality. Conversely, files with sampling rates below 128 Kbps will not be played properly.
- **Do not try recording copyright protected MP3 files.**
Certain "securized" files are encrypted and code protected to prevent illegal copying. These files are of the following types: Windows Media™ (registered trade mark of Microsoft Inc) and SDMITM (registered trade mark of The SDMI Foundation). You cannot copy such files.
- **Your DVD player only accepts one level of file directory. Consequently you must choose:**
 - either to save all your MP3 recording files at the root of the disc;
 - and/or create folders in the directory for each artist or music type (e.g.classical, rock, jazz, etc)
- **Important:** The above recommendations cannot be taken as a guarantee that the DVD player will play MP3 recordings, or as an assurance of sound quality. You should note that certain technologies and methods for MP3 file recording on CD-Rs prevent optimal playback of these files on your DVD player (degraded sound quality and in some cases, inability of the player to read the files).

1 FM antenna connections

- Connect the FM antenna to the FM 75Ω COAXIAL terminal.
- Unwind the antenna wire and then fasten it to a wall in an area where reception is best.
- If reception is poor, connect the outdoor antenna.
Remove the existing FM antenna before connecting the 75Ω coaxial cable.

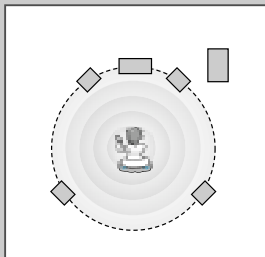
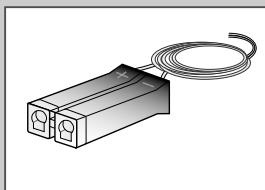


Cooling fan

The cooling fan in the rear center of the unit ensures reliable operation and protects it from overheating. It will operate automatically as needed to circulate cool air when the temperature rises past a set threshold. For safety, please take note of the following points:

- Make sure that the unit is well-ventilated. Poor ventilation may cause damage by overheating.
- Make sure that the cooling fan or ventilation holes are not obstructed. (If the ventilation holes are blocked by newspaper, clothes, etc., heat builds up inside the main unit, resulting in a risk of fire.)
- When the power is supplied to the main unit, the cooling fan will be activated.

Setting the delay time

You can customize the sound to best fit the specific acoustics of the room by adding a delay to the sound from the center and surround speakers.

Ideal speaker placement

1 Center speaker
