Radio Interference Regulations

This apparatus has been produced to comply with "BS 800: 1988".

NOTE

Microwave Output Power varies according to the method of measurement. Until recently almost all microwave oven manufacturers used the JIS standard but from September 1990 the IEC 705 standard has been adopted in U.K. as this is the common standard used in Europe for measuring microwave outpout power. The cooking times and power levels in the accompanying AEG cookery book are for microwave ovens with an output power of 850 W (IEC 705). If you use other cookery books or follow instructions on food packs that have cooking times and power levels calculated using the IEC 705 method then use the ones given for 850 W microwave ovens. If you are using recipes that are not calculated using the IEC 705 method or, if you are unsure, carefully check the food at the end of the stated cooking time to verify that is properly cooked and pipng hot all through. The IEC 705 rating will eventually be adopted by all manufacturers and cookery writers. Until this time take care to ensure that all foods are throughly cooked.

Caution

- 1. Please remember that in the microwave mode the oven only heats the liquid in a container rather than the container itself. Therefore, even though the lid of a container is not hot to the touch when removed from the oven, please remember that the food/liquid inside will be hot and will release the same amount of steam and/or spitting when the lid is removed as in conventional cooking.
- 2. Always test the temperature of cooked food yourself especially if you are heating or cooking food/liquid for babies. It is advisable never to consume food/liquid straight from the oven but allow it to stand for a few minutes and stir food/liquid to distribute heat evenly.
- Food containing a mixture of fat and water, e.g. stock, should stand for 30 60 seconds in the oven after
 it has been turned off. This is to allow the mixture to settle and to prevent bubbling when a spoon is placed
 in the food/liquid or a stock cube is added.
- 4. Always follow the cooking instructions detailed in our cookbook when preparing/cooking food/liquid and remember that there are certain foods, e.g. Christmas puddings, jam and mincemeat, which heat up very quickly, in the microwave mode. When heating or cooking foods with a high fat or sugar content do not use plastic containers.
- 5. Cooking utensils may become hot because of heat transferred from the heated food. This is especially true if plastic wrap has been covering the top and handles of the utensil. Oven gloves may be needed to handle the utensil.
- 6. Do not use re-cycled paper products in this oven. Impurities in these products can cause arcing.

Installation

- Make sure all the packing materials are removed from inside the door.
- 2. Inspect the oven after unpacking for any visual damage such as:
 - Misaligned Oven Door
 - · Damaged Oven Door
 - · Dents or Holes in Oven Window and Screen
 - · Dents in Cavity

If any of the above are visible, DO NOT use the oven, and report the damage to your AEG dealer

- 3. This Microwave Oven weighs 22 kg and must be placed on a horizontal surface that is strongenough to support this weight.
- 4. The oven must be placed away from high temper atures and steam
- 5. DO NOT install above a heat source.
- 6. DO NOT place anything on the oven.
 - 7 Keep the oven at least 5 cm away from bot side-walls, 10 cm away from the underside of a overhead kitchen cupboard, and 10 cm away from rear wall to ensure the correct ventilation.
 - 8 As with any appliance, close supervision is necessary when used by children

WARNING — THIS APPLIANCE MUST BE EARTHED.

- 1. The power cord is 1.1 m long, the plug socket should be within easy reach of this cord.
- If the appliance is not connected through a plug and socket, then a double-pole switch must be provided in the installation.
- 3. If the oven is connected through a plug and socket, the plug must be fitted with a 13 A fuse.
- If you have any doubt about the connection of your oven, consult a qualified electrician.

Always ensure that the roller ring is installed correctly.

Place it in the oven so that the up marking is visible. Do not insert upside down.

Place the tray onto the spindle and roller ring.

DO NOT forcibly rotate the Turntable Tray.

When cooking several individual items, such as potatoes, they can be placed directly on the tray leaving an equal space between them for even cooking

How to Set the Oven Control

Please Note:

- Each time a pad is touched, a beep will sound to verify the touch.
- 2. The time of day automatically returns to the display window when the oven turns off.
- If the clear pad is touched, this erases all the information given to the oven except the clock and memory.

Make sure the oven is properly installed and plugged in

NOW PLACE A CUP OF WATER IN THE OVEN AND CLOSE THE DOOR. FOLLOW THE OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS BELOW.



Microwave Cooking

- To ensure the best microwave and defrost results, be sure to start with a cool oven. This is important if the grill mode has been used prior to microwave cooking. Let the oven cool for 15 20 minutes with the door slightly open.
- Power level can be controlled from PL9 (equivalent to 850 watt IEC) down to PL1 (equivalent to 100 watt IEC) by using the power level pads.







Should food be cooked and removed from the oven, before the set time is completed (i.e. I min still shows on the display) touch the pad before cooking a further item.

If a mistake in the power level or time settings is noticed before cooking has started, the values can be reset. If the mistake is noticed after cooking has started, touch the clear pad and reset both the power level and time. Cooking time cannot be set unless power level is set previously.

This will enable you to reheat a selection of foods by use of the 5 programs.

- 5. Allow programs 1, 2, 4 to stand for 1 minute before serving.
- Allow program 3 to stand for 30 seconds before stirring or serving.
- Allow program 5 to stand for 3 minutes before serving.
- Ensure all food is thoroughly reheated before serving; continue cooking on variable power and time if foods are not completely heated after the Auto Reheat program.



The auto-defrost function is designed to defrost by automatically utilizing three different power levels. It begins defrosting on a medium/high power level to quickly activate defrosting. The middle program defrosts on a medium-low power level. The last program of the AUTO-DEFROST is on a low power level to ensure equalization of defrosting action throughout the food. Once the oven is started, it will gradually defrost the food and power level will automatically reduce during the defrosting time. This will eliminate or reduce the normal required standing time.

NOTE

The "Auto Defrost" program can only be used for up to 1 lb/450 g in weight.

This will enable you to defrost by weight selections of food by use of the 3 programs.

Programing Combinations

This oven has the ability to be programed to do up four consecutive functions. These combinations are given below and either the complete program or part of it can be used.



NOTE

In continuous cooking, if DEFROST program is set after the cook program, then DEFROST will always start before cook.

Warning

Please Read Carefully

- (a) DO NOT allow anyone to service the oven other than an Authorized AEG Service Agent. To do so will void the warranty. It is dangerous for anyone other than a service technician trained by AEG to perform repairs on it.
- (b) DO NOT, under any circumstances, remove the outer cover, door or control panel. This too will void the warranty
- (c) DO NOT place any object between the front plate of the oven and the door.
- (d) DO NOT operate the oven if the door seal is damaged or the door does not close properly. Inspect these areas for damage. If there is any damage, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a service technician trained by AEG.
- (e) DO NOT operate the oven in nucrowave setting when empty, as this may damage the oven.
- (1) Always keep the door seals (inside of the door and the oven front plate) clean by wiping regularly with a damp cloth and mild detergent, so that any grease, soil or spatters are not allowed to build up.

The AEG Microwave Oven is designed to give long, sale and satisfactory service. With it, as with many electrical appliances, there are some basic rules to follow to assure peak performance.

- 1 DO NOT use a metal container when using the microwave function as microwaves cannot penetrate metal. DO NOT use utensils with gold or silver trim as these may cause arcing in the microwave oven. Porcelain or glass are suitable as containers.
- DO NOT cook eggs in their shells. The expansion and build up of pressure could cause the egg to explode.
 After cracking and removing the egg from the shell always pierce yolk with a fork or skewer before frying or poaching.
- 3. DO NOT cook food in a bottle or sealed container.
- 4 DO NOT cook food with a shell such as a chestnut. Make a split in the shell with a kitchen knife.
- 5 DO NOT use the oven for any other purpose than cooking (e.g. Drying clothes).
- 6 DO NOT insert any object into the openings on the outer case.
- 7. DO NOT touch, or allow any object to cover the openings on the top of the outer case during cooking.
- 8 DO NOT heat oil or fat for deep frying in a microwave oven, it may overheat.
- 9. When using the grill and combination grill, the glass door and turntable tray will get hot. It is recommended to use oven gloves
- 10. Liquids must be briskly stirred or poured (to mix in air) before being heated in a microwave oven. If air is not mixed into a liquid, it can vigorously boil over in the oven, or delayed eruptive boiling of it may occur after removal from the oven.
- 11. Plastic or paper cont. mers designed for microwave use should only be used for short cooking periods.
- 12. DO NOT use the oven cavity for any type of storage, such as paper, cookbook, etc.
- 13. Avoid heating baby foods in their glass jars; transfer to a container suitable for use in a microwave oven.
- 14. Only use browning dishes or skillets specifically designed for use in a microwave oven. Do not exceed manufacturers recommended pre-heat times.
- 15. Never lean on the door or allow a child to swing on it when the door is open. Injury could result.
- 16. To reduce the risk of fire in the cavity;
 - a) Do not overcook food. Carefully attend oven if paper, plastic or other combustible material are placed inside the oven to facilitate cooking.
 - b) Remove wire twist-ties from plastic bags before placing in oven.
 - c) Do not use recycled paper products in this oven. Impurities in these products can cause arcing which may result in fire.
- 17. If materials inside the oven should ignite, keep oven door closed, turn oven off, and disconnect the power cord or shut off power.
- 18. This microwave oven is specifically designed to cook food and for use in homes. It is not designed for industrial laboratory use or commercial use.
- 19. DO NOT use outdoors.

Cleaning your microwave oven is easy!

After every use just wipe the inside of the oven with a soft damp cloth and mild detergent (washing up liquid). Wipe out well and dry!

This oven is provided with the self-cleaning coat on the top wall of cavity, which serves to clean up the food spatters.

DO NOT use an abrasive powder or pad and cleaners on this self-cleaning coated wall, as they will damage the coat

FOR MORE STUBBORN STAINS:

- 1. Oven Walls and Floor To keep the oven in tip-top operating condition, clean the oven with a damp cloth after each use. Always use a soft cloth, never an abrasive powder or pad. If time has elapsed between cleaning and food particles have dried-on, let a cup of water boil for about 3 minutes in the oven. The steam build up will soften the dried-on particles.
- 2. Turntable Tray This can be removed from the oven and washed either by hand or in the dishwasher. Handle with care - it's glass, therefore breakable!
- 3. Inside of Oven Door This area is part of the sealing system which prevents microwave leakage. It is extremely important that the door be kept clean at all times.
- 4. Oven Front Face This is also part of the door seal. It must be kept clean at all times.

to use a more abrasive product, i.e. a special microwave oven cleaner.

6. Do not use any abrasive substances on the door seals, hinges or distribution cover.

Outside the Oven

- 1. The Outer Casing This is easily cleaned with a damp cloth.
- 2. The Door This should be cleaned with a damp cloth. DO NOT use any abrasives as this may scratch the surface and impair vision into the oven

Ovens with Grills

- When the grill mode is used grease, acids and salts may be deposited on the oven cavity.
- To clean the oven use a special microwave cleaner on the sides of the oven only.
- To clean the roof, set the empty oven on grill for 30 minutes, this will activate the self clean lining Splatters will be eliminated by decomposition to carbonic acid gas and moisture.

Do Not

USE ANY ABRASIVE SCOURING PRODUCTS USE ANY COMMERCIAL OVEN CLEANERS. USE ALKALINE CLEANER ON ANY PAINTED/COATED AREAS OF THE OVEN USE ANY CLEANIR ON THE SELF-CLEANING AREA OF ROOF.

NOTE

WHEN CLEANING, THE OVEN MUST BE SWITCHED OFF

Before You Call for Service

1. If the oven does not work at all;

Check that the oven is correctly plugged in.

Check that the wall socket is working properly by plugging in another appliance.

2. If the microwave power will not come on:

Check that the door is securely closed and the timer is set.

Unless the door is closed properly engage the safety interlocks, the microwave energy will not operate
